Mobile response and walk-ins available during set hours.</p> <p>Crisis Safe Bed: Short term (up to 30 days) stay for individuals in crisis (referred by police) who are not suitable for hospitalization.</p> <p>Kingston Mobile Crisis Rapid Response Team (MCRTT): Immediate response team comprised of a uniformed Kingston Police Officer and AMHS-KFLA Crisis Worker.</p> <p>Kingston Crisis Outreach & Support Team (COAST): Follow-up support team (plain clothed police officer and AMHS-KFLA Crisis Worker) to complete assessment & support in the community.</p>
<p>Mandy Locke Program Manager, ACTT 613-328-3594 mlocke@amhs-kfla.ca</p>	<p>Assertive Community Treatment Teams (ACTT): Designed as a hospital without walls, ACTT is a client-centered, mobile mental health service delivery model for individuals living in community who have the most serious mental illnesses.</p> <p>Two interprofessional teams are staffed by those who provide specialised supports including Occupational Therapists, RNs, Social Workers, Addictions Specialists, Peer Support Workers, Vocational Specialists, Psychiatrists & others.</p>

Clients are followed by the Ontario Review Board.</p> <p>Housing support services in Kingston are delivered in our new, state-of-the-art residential building.</p>

Mobile response and walk-ins available during set hours.</p> <p>L&A Mobile Crisis Intervention Team (MCIT): Collaborative response team comprised of a uniformed OPP Officer and AMHS-KFLA Crisis Worker dispatched by OPP as needed to support those in crisis.</p> <p>Rural Addictions Treatment/Substance Use: 1:1 and group support available in office, in the community and embedded in some rural secondary schools to support those with substance use concerns.</p> <p>Rural Motherwise: Specialized, community-based addiction supports to those pregnant/parenting children 0-6.</p> <p>Rural Problem Gambling: Support to youth & adults with concerns around gambling, gaming and other behavioural/process addictions.</p> <p>Napanee Residential Program: Provides affordable housing and attached support to assist those with serious mental illness in successfully maintaining safe housing and with daily living.</p>

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
